Subject to terms and conditions set out below:

1. When licensing a new coffee milling plant due consideration will be taken to ensure that processing over-capacity is not created in a given local area or zone in accordance with section 23 (1) of the Act. In the case of a private investor, the Coffee Board of Kenya shall arbitrate to decide how the farmers are distributed between the existing and the proposed new plant before issuing a licence. A licence for a new milling plant will only be issued to persons, Co-operative Societies or Companies who have fulfilled the conditions.
2. The Board, in consultation with the Minister, may cancel, vary or suspend any licence issued to a person, Co-operative Society or Company if such person, Co-operative Society or Company fails to comply with the terms and conditions of the licence.
3. The millers shall submit their milling returns to the Board on a weekly basis.
4. A milling licence may be suspended where a licensee, without any good reason acceptable to the Board, continues to default in returns.
